#### APPLICATION FOR ARREST WARRANT

BEFORE ME, the undersigned Judge of the Criminal District Court, Parish of Orleans, State of Louisiana, personally came and appeared Detective Jacob Lundy, employed by the New Orleans Department of Police at 715 South Broad Street, New Orleans Louisiana,

WHO, after being duly sworn by me, deposed and stated that a warrant of arrest should issue for male of 1994, Who, on the 1994, Who, on the 1994, in the Parish of Orleans, State of Louisiana did commit the crime of Second Degree Murder as defined in Louisiana Revised Statute, Title 14, Article 30.1.

The facts and circumstances given in support of this application are as follows;

Or 2013 a KNOWN New Orleans Police Department Detective was conducting surveillance on a public street near the block of Place (New Orleans LA). The KNOWN Detective noted a suspicious vehicle make several passes. The detective then heard gunshots, after which the previously noted vehicle fled the area at a high rate of speed. The detective broadcast the vehicle description and circumstances.

Following broadcast, a second KNOWN New Orleans Police Department Detective pursued the suspect vehicle, during the pursuit several firearms, including three (3) AK-47 assault rifles were discarded from the vehicle (later recovered and confirmed as the same caliber [.762] as that used in the homicide). The vehicle eventually stopped, a number of subjects fled from the vehicle; two were apprehended (one being named in this warrant).

Assisting Detectives of the assigned homicide squad located private CCTV video from a KNOWN location near the scene of the homicide; a review of the video confirmed the vehicle make/model/color noted by the first KNOWN Detective described above, as well as clothing and build matches of the two suspects apprehended following the homicide (including the suspect named in this warrant). Both apprehended suspects were captured on CCTV running to the homicide location armed with assault rifles of the same type recovered following the pursuit.

Additional data retrieval is requested as a result of known association with a criminal street gang as defined by Louisiana Revised Statute Title 15, Article 1404.

A reference swab is needed for confirmation of the CODIS hit. The KNOWN evidence analyzed was material to the offense. The factual basis for the collection of the listed subject's DNA is indefinite.
